

During the interim while we do the needed concrete and lot improvements we will be providing dumpster for trash collection. Please do not put restricted items such as tires or paint into the dumpsters.

Fish & Lake Committee:

We are grateful for the community's generous support of Fish & Lake at the Pancake Breakfast, and for saving aluminum cans for the bins located near the compactor and campground. Jones Lake Management will be treating the lake for algae on Tuesday, August 5th. They will be using a product called Vodaguard C, and will apply it in the three large lake fingers. This product will be dispersed widely across the lake surface, and is safe when applied this way. Please avoid contact with the product when it is visible, and with the clumps of algae that the product will create as it works. Everything should be back to normal within a day or two, except for less visible algae and fewer chances for a harmful algae bloom! Our next meeting will be August 27th - we will be deciding on fall fish stocking. Donations towards that effort are gladly accepted.

Garden & Landscaping Committee:

Activities for spring/summer are nearly finished with the Spring / Summer work around the community! Trees & gardens mulched, courtesy of the plentiful rain, flowers are flourishing, and so are the weeds ... an ongoing project to keep them at bay!
