<u>Projects update</u> The fall maintenance punch list saw the exteriors of the mail house at Recreation Area 3 and the restrooms at 3 and 4 repaired and painted. Underway is an upgrade and expansion of the dry docks at the Lodge and Areas 1,3, and 4. Old posts have been removed and replaced by larger, more secure posts. The dry docks will see more stone and landscaping of the areas. Maintenance has begun repairing and upgrading picnic tables. On tap for winter projects is the interior upgrade of the restrooms at the recreation areas.

News you can use According to news reports, the state awarded LORCO a \$1 million grant to pay for two new raw sewage pumps, a maintenance building and 22,000 feet of piping. The piping will connect Cinnamon Lake to West Salem's sewage treatment plant. The new West Salem sewer plant is currently under construction. LORCO anticipates awarding bids in early 2022 for the projects, per media reports.

The January 9th meeting will be part of the ongoing Coffee and Conversation series, at 2 p.m. in the Lodge. The meetings on January 12th and 20th will be at 7pm in the lodge. Hats Off and a great big thank you to: All members who paid their January 2022 dues and assessment invoice by the due date. Also, a big thank you for all who throw their advertising mail into the recycle bags in the mail houses. It is helping move paper out of the landfill and into the recycle stream. We are looking to have better collection containers in place by early Spring. Let's all work on recycling to help keep the trash costs down. Remember glass, plastic and cardboard box recycling bins are located by the sewer treatment plant. Every little bit helps.

Mark your calendars: We are holding more road improvement meetings in February. An online meeting will be held on February 23rd at 7pm (instructions for joining the meeting are on the CLA website calendar), February 24th at 7pm in the Lodge, February 27th at 2pm in the Lodge (this meeting will also be streamed online-same instructions for joining are on the website calendar). The general consensus from members who attended the January meetings was to fix the roads in the shortest period of time, borrow the money if we have to, and develop an ongoing road maintenance plan. Please look for another survey in the February LORCO bills. Give us your feedback on the road project if you haven't had a chance to attend any of the meetings, or even if you have attended them.

<u>Coffee and Conversation</u>: The next Coffee and Conversation is set for February 13th at 2pm in the Lodge. Improving the roads will continue to be the main topic. Members are also encouraged to bring up topics they feel are important to Cinnamon Lake.

Fish & Lake News: Don't forget the Spaghetti Dinner on February 19th from 5-7pm in the Lodge. The dinner will be both dine-in and carry-out. Remember, the sauce is great! Our lake water quality was a major topic at their last meeting. They have received an estimate of \$8,800 to develop a water testing program. The committee is still waiting for estimates for weir improvements. Plans are being developed for dealing with the cormorants and geese this spring. The cormorants are eating the fish that has been stocked in the lake. Fish stocking costs money and the cormorants are feeding on our dime. The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) recommends a concentrated effort in the spring to harass the cormorants and chase them off. The geese are also affecting the lake water quality. They may be nice, fuzzy, little lovable creatures, but they leave a long trail of unsightly waste. As the waste dissolves, it affects the water quality, which is not for the betterment of our lake. Harassing the geese and addling their eggs is a USDA suggested way of minimizing damage to the lake. Stay tuned for more plans on dealing with the cormorants and the geese. The Fish & Lake Committee always welcomes volunteers. Their next meeting is scheduled for February 22nd at 7pm in the Lodge.

Roads, Roads, Roads: General consensus from members who attended the January and February meetings was to fix the roads in the shortest period of time, borrow the money if we have to, and develop an ongoing road maintenance plan. If you haven't filled out the survey that came in the February LORCO mailing, please do so. The survey needs to be back in the office by March 10th. The online survey would also need to be completed by March 10. Please give us your feedback on the road project. Talks with two banks continue and additional work still needs to be done to complete a package to send out for bids. Once the final package is completed, additional member meetings will be held to discuss the package and the plan well before ballots are sent out.

<u>Coffee and Conversation:</u> the next Coffee and Conversation is set for March 13th at 2 pm in the Lodge. Members are encouraged to bring up topics they feel are important to Cinnamon Lake. During the last meeting, discussion focused on Cinnamon Lake's Declaration of CCRs and if it need to be changed.

Fish & Lake News: After a successful Spaghetti Dinner, the next event on the calendar for Fish & Lake is the Pancake Breakfast on April 23rd. Planning is also underway for the Spring Garage Sale on May 20th and 21st. At the last Fish & Lake meeting, the committee agreed to move ahead with the purchase of algaecide to treat the lake. Protecting lake quality tops Fish & Lake's priorities. An estimate of \$8,800 to set up a water testing program generated discussion on other possible ways to start consistently monitoring water quality. A \$61,000 estimate to clean out and improve the weirs was also discussed, especially whether there was a way to stage it out. Stay tuned for a spring campaign to deal with the cormorants and geese. Cormorants eat the fish; the geese foul the lake (pun intended). Large number of geese leave a large amount of waste behind. As the waste dissolves, it can harm the lake. The USDA and the ODNR are providing guidance. The Fish & Lake Committee welcomes volunteers. Their next meeting is scheduled for March 22nd at 7 pm in the Lodge.

<u>Compactor-</u>The compactor is leased and serviced through All State Rentals. The container is through Rumpke and they are the ones who change out the container and open top dumpster. As you know the trash compactor was not working properly at the end of 2021 and the start of 2022. The issue was with a hydraulic cylinder. All State Rentals was waiting for parts to come in before they could repair it. We understand the inconvenience it caused our membership, and we are looking for solutions to avoid this issue in the future.

We want to address some problems with members not following the guidelines for our household trash compactor. We are seeing an increase in members leaving items around the compactor, along with reports of members putting large items into the compactor. Some large items have been: vacuum cleaners, TVs, lawn furniture, household furniture, carpet, yard waste, cardboard, and a variety of other items. These items have caused problems with the compactor and are taking up space for household trash. The larger items need to be disposed of in the open top dumpster which is behind the office. If you paid your Jan. 2022 Association bill by the due date, you have one (1) free use of the open top dumpster. Otherwise it is \$15 per load. Currently the available hours for the open top dumpster are during normal office hours. However we are working to provide some weekend hours around the time of the spring and fall garage sales. Watch the website and mail house for details.

We are also asking everyone to use the recycling bins as much as possible, especially for cardboard. The recycling containers are next to the sewer lab building on Cinnamon Dr. East. Don't forget about the aluminum can container that Fish/Lake has by the compactor. By recycling, we can all help keep the trash cost down.

<u>Roads-</u>Thank you to all who completed the road survey. We are still working our way through them. First let's remember what the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (CC&R's) state: Page 14, #9, C a, (iii), 4 "Every Lot and every Lot owner (and if more than one Lot owner, then all owners of a Lot, jointly and severally) shall be charged with an equal share of each annual and special assessment attributable to each such Lot."

Here are several comments and suggestions that were made:

Many wrote about how the assessment should work: 1. charging based on the type of road members live on 2. charge per vehicle, with heavier vehicles being charged more than others, 3. charging seniors less since it is the younger adults who will benefit from road improvements, 4. only homeowners be allowed to vote, 5. lots with a home should have a separate fee, 6. charge per owner and not per lot. While these are all good thoughts, we have to follow the current CC&R's. However, they make a good argument for changing the CCRs and until the members vote to change the CCRs, any vote on a road assessment must be equally distributed among all lot owners.

A large number of geese leave a large amount of waste behind that is harmful to the lake. Harassing and addling prevents the ne generation of geese from making Cinnamon Lake their home. Green lasers have also wor by harassing chasing the geese away. Cormorants have been sighted and their nesting se son is here. Cormorants eat large amounts of fish and we don't want them to eat the fish v are stocking the lake with. Their waste is also killing the trees where they are roosting. The United States Department of Agriculture recommends a concentrated effort to harass and chase them off. Discussion at the last meeting touched on the need to raise money to imp the weir system for water filtration. That current estimate is roughly \$62,000. The committee will explore the possibility for any available grant money and is looking for a grant writer to help with the process. The Fish & Lake Committee always welcomes volunteers

Under What Authority

The Cinnamon Lake Association Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions Section 9, Paragraph 4 (d) (page 16) states that "the Board of Directors may recommend to the membership, at any time, in its discretion, special assessments to construct, reconstruct, or to replace capital improvements on the Common Facilities to the extent that reserves therefore are insufficient." No limitations are placed as to how the assessment is to be funded. Voting power is delineated in the Bylaws.

Article 5, Section 1 (t) of the Bylaws (Powers) authorizes the Board to borrow up to \$15,000 "and for any amounts greater, so long as the same receives the approval of a majority of Members in Good Standing that are present in person or by absentee ballot at a duly called or held meeting where quorum is present."

In addition, subsection (u) of Article 5, Section 1 of the Bylaws allows the Board of Directors to "Assign the Association's right to future income, including the right to receive Association Assessments and insurance proceeds."

Board Okays Special Road Assessments

The Cinnamon Lake Association, Inc., Board of Directors is placing on the 2022 Annual Ballot a Special Road Assessment to raise the necessary funds to fix our roads. The Board of Directors supports this special road assessment.

Passage of this special road assessment will allow the Board of Directors to borrow up to \$2.5 million as part of a plan to fix the roads in as short a period of time as possible. Included in the scope of the plan is fixing the parking lots and replacing some culverts. All roads, to include gravel roads, will be repaired and improved.

To pay the loan back, members will be assessed \$30 per lot per month over seven (7) years. This money will be pledged to the bank as collateral. Billings will be on October 1^{st} and April 1^{st} of each year.

The Board of Directors feels that, given the current restrictions and limitations on adequately funding CLA operations, it is necessary to go to the membership for a special road assessment. The condition of the roads are integral to our community. The ability to buy or sell a home here is tied to the condition of the roads, in other words, property values depend in part upon road condition. The condition of the roads is the most frequent complaint heard from members and prospective buyers.

Cinnamon Lake has grown a lot in the past few years, and there is potential for continued growth. The Board of Directors feel strongly that to meet current needs and future growth, upgrading the roads is important. Delaying any improvements, or even stretching the road project out over several years, would only increase the repair costs.

The Board of Directors is committed to paying the loan off in the shortest, financially prudent time frame. Any monies collected in excess of the loan repayment will be used to begin funding an ongoing future road maintenance program.

Primary scope of work defined

Prior to repair work beginning on the existing paved roads, cutting of berm is required up to 16" for positive drainage. All roads are to be broom swept and debris removed from site. All pot holes are to be repaired prior to scratching. Pave Type I Surface course at 1.5" average to entire surface area of existing roads.

Prior to repair work beginning on the existing chip and sealed roads, cutting of berm is required up to 16" for positive drainage. Roads are to be repaired with Type I surface course. All roads are to be broom swept and debris removed from site. Apply limestone and roll with a minimum of two rollers. Immediately following rolling choke roads with limestone and re-roll entire road surface.

Prior to repair work beginning on the current gravel roads, cutting of berm is required up to 16" for positive drainage. Roads are to be leveled prior to chip and seal. Level entire road surface and fill pot holes and then rolled for compaction. Prime all roads and choke with limestone. Chip and seal then roll with a minimum of two rollers. Immediately following rolling choke roads with limestone and re-roll entire road surface.

Fish & Lake Committee News: Fish & Lake has begun an ongoing water quality testing program. Volunteers are doing the testing to lower the costs. Currently tests are being done for levels of eColi, dissolved oxygen, phosphorous, nitrogen and microcystin toxin at four locations in the lake. For recreational use, the eColi threshold is 235 with 1,000 forcing a closure. All four test sites were well below the threshold: Finger 1 at 91; Finger 3 at 106; Finger 4 at 48; and near the dam at 1. Microcystin toxin is the cause of harmful algae blooms. According to the State of Ohio, the threshold for microcystins, is 8. Cinnamon Lake results showed Finger 1 at 0.564; Finger 2 at 0.373; Finger 4 at 2.42; and the Lake at less than 0.300. Generally, talking to vendors and those in the field, the lake is safe. Additionally, to stay ahead of algae problems, the lake was treated with algaecide on August 23. The ongoing testing and tracking program is designed to help gauge the condition of the lake and to determine from where harmful items might be entering the lake. Please attend the Fish & Lake meetings to learn more; volunteers are always welcome. Fish & Lake's next meeting is scheduled for September 27th at 7 pm in the Lodge.
